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Inpatient Days

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State Field ID	Field	Definition
Inpatient Days by Payer		
200110	Medicaid-FFS	Qualified Medicaid providers are paid for each covered service such as an office visit, test or procedure according to rates set by the state. States may develop their payment rates based on: (1) the costs of providing the service. (2) a review of what commercial payers pay in the private market. (3) a percentage of what Medicare pays for equivalent services. The service provided must correspond to the description of covered services under the Medicaid state plan, and the service must be delivered by a qualified Medicaid provider.
200120	Medicaid-MCO	Medicaid and additional services in the United States through an arrangement between a state Medicaid agency and managed care organizations (MCOs) that accept a set payment -- "capitation" -- for these services. The state pays the MCO a monthly premium to cover the services provided to a beneficiary.
200130	Medicare-FFS	A system of health care payment in which a provider is paid separately for each service.
200140	Medicare-MCO	A managed care plan is one way to get coverage for the health care bills that Medicare doesn't pay. Medicare-managed care plans are MCOs or PPOs that provide basic Medicare coverage plus other coverage to fill the gaps in Medicare coverage.
200150	Other government	DOD TRICARE, VHA, and IHS, etc. -- serve populations with whom the federal government has a special relationship, respectively, military personnel and their dependents, veterans and Native Americans.
200160	PPO's, insurance and non-Medicaid/ Medicare MCO	Preferred Provider Organization (PPO) -- A health care organization composed of physicians, hospitals or other providers that provide health care services at a reduced fee. A PPO is like an HMO, but care is paid for as it is received instead of in advance in the form of a scheduled fee. Health insurance is a type of insurance coverage that pays for medical and surgical expenses incurred by the insured. Health insurance can reimburse the insured for expenses incurred from illness or injury or pay the care provider directly. Health maintenance organization (HMO). A form of health insurance combining a range of coverage on a group basis. A group of doctors and other medical professionals offer care through the HMO for a flat monthly rate with no deductibles. However, only visits to professionals within the HMO network are covered by the policy.
200170	Private pay	A type of payment where the patient's own resources pay for the care. A contract is signed between the person responsible for payment and the facility.
200180	Charity care	Free or discounted medical care and especially hospital care provided to patients who do not have health insurance or are unable to pay for all or part of medical costs due to limited income or financial hardship.
200100	Total inpatient days	Total inpatient days by payer.

200210	Acute-care hospital	Discharged to an acute-care hospital.
200220	Other SNF or ICF	Discharged to another skilled nursing (SNF) or intermediate care facility (ICF).
200230	Group care	Care given to a group of people with similar disabilities within a residence. Patients in a group home receive custodial care and care provided by skilled and medically trained professionals.
200240	Home health care	Supportive care provided in the home. Care may be provided by licensed health care professionals who provide medical care needs or by professional caregivers who provide daily care to help to ensure the activities of daily living (ADLs) are met.
200250	Home (self care)	Discharged to home.
200260	Death	Patient dies while admitted.
200270	Other/unknown	Other or unknown discharge statuses.
200200	Total discharges	Total discharges by discharge status.

200340	Off-line beds	Number of beds the facility used for other purposes other than long-term care (i.e. offices, physical therapy).
